

Transfer Student Minimum Admissions Standards

A Transfer Student is a student who has previously attended another postsecondary institution and has never been enrolled at ULM. This *does not* include students who took Dual Enrollment or Collegiate courses as high school students, or those who enrolled at another institution for the first time the summer immediately after their high school graduation.

To be eligible for immediate admission, a transfer student must have earned:

- a transferrable associate degree (AA, AALT, AS or ASLT), or
- a minimum 18 college-level academic hours with a 2.00 minimum GPA, and
- must have completed a minimum of one college-level English, and
- college-level mathematics course designed to fulfill general educational requirements.

A **Transfer Student** who has earned fewer than 18 college-level academic hours must have a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA on those courses **and** must meet freshmen admissions standards.

Transfers from non-U.S. postsecondary institutions must meet minimum standards. Admission decisions will be made after the receipt of an academic transcript evaluation from an accredited evaluation service. World Education Services (WES) – www.wes.org – is preferred.

International students for whom English is a second language and whose language of instruction is English are required to successfully complete a ULM English proficiency test. They must have completed a college-level mathematics and be eligible to enroll in a college-level English course.
